Winner, Napier Waller Art Prize 2020 Matt Jones, Yarn, 2020 yarn and recycled waste fabric 183 x 183 x 18 cm

Matt Jones, a former Army major who served in East Timor, won the 2020 Napier Waller Art Prize for his work Yarn. His artist statement for Yarn reads as follows:

There have been times when I didn't want to communicate. I didn't want to admit to the difficulties I had encountered. I felt I didn't have the language to describe the sense of shame that I could neither name nor admit to experiencing.

Alienation is the idea at the heart of this artwork, expressed from my personal experience.

Its inspiration comes from the blue and yellow maritime signal flag, Kilo, which has the meaning 'I want to communicate with you.'

The act of making this oversized signal flag is a declaration that I wish to leave the messiness of the past behind me. It's time to pick up the loose threads and broken relationships, be they personal, societal or institutional.

The dimensions of the work mirror my height and arm span to create an unorthodox self-portrait.

The materials used are unapologetically crude, gathered while I had an opportunity between a period of quarantined self-isolation after returning from Korea, and the subsequently imposed national lockdown. We tell our stories with what we have, not with what we hope that we might have.

Yarning is where we connect. To listen and understand. The Furphy wagon. The familiarity of mates.

Comms check.

The way Matt describes Yarn, as symbolic of his desire to communicate, resonates with us as Commissioners of this Royal Commission. We acknowledge the poignant beauty, the deceptive simplicity and the power of the work. We thank Matt and the Australian War Memorial for giving us permission to reproduce Yarn.

The Napier Waller Art Prize is open to all current and former service personnel in the Australian Defence Force. The prize encourages artistic excellence, promotes the transformative power of creativity, and raises awareness of the experiences and talent of service personnel. Initiated in 2018, the Napier Waller Art Prize was named after Mervyn Napier Waller, an Australian artist who enlisted in the Australian Imperial Force in August 1915 and was wounded in 1917.

New Program for People with Dementia and Carers at UC Hospital

Canberra Health Services and the University of Canberra are currently recruiting participants for a new program to evaluate its effectiveness for people with dementia and carers. The program is called SPICE: Sustainable Personalised Interventions for Cognition, Care & Engagement.

SPICE includes: physical activity, nutrition assessment, group activities, education, carers support, and appointments with an occupational therapist in the home.

SPICE includes free access to a range of allied health professionals at the University of Canberra Hospital over 12 weeks. At the end of the 12 weeks, participants will be eligible to receive a \$100 gift card.

De La Salle Memorial Upgrade

De La Salle College memorial for students killed in RAAF Caribou upgrade

This year marks the 50th anniversary of the crash of RAAF Caribou A4-233 which occurred at Kudjeru on 28 August 1972. This accident remains the largest peacetime loss of life for the RAAF and saw the deaths of four Australian service personnel and 21 Army Cadets, all but one being students at De La Salle at the time. The only survivors of the crash were five of the cadets, one of whom died later in hospital from injuries he sustained in the crash.

As this is a milestone event the school wanted to make it a special to commemorate the tragic loss of so many students at one time. Part of this was to upgrade the current memorial that has been in place for the last 50 Years.



The Returned and Services League of Australia (Port Moresby Sub Branch) was approached for some possible assistance with the restoration. Previously the school had received a quote for K19 000.00 While not committing to anything the RSL sourced another quote from a local Bomana company that came out approximately have the original cost. The RSL executive committee was approached and they agreed to offer K5 000.00 to the school to assist in the restoration. With everything now settled work on the upgrade was started Monday the 11 July 2022.





On Friday the 22nd Jul the memorial upgrade was completed and handed over to the school.





With the memorial now completed It will be officially unveiled on the 29th August 2022 at the 50th anniversary service With The Chief of the Australian Airforce and Head of Australian Defence staff in attendance.

" Although only very few volunteers and members of the Eddison Day Club have over the past few months, at times only two, been coming to the Canberra Irish Club on a Friday for lunch, we had been hoping that more would venture out and attend. The latest wave of COVID-19 infections from the new variants are increasing the cases in the ACT and the states. The Canberra Irish Club has informed us that they have not reported any cases in the last few weeks. We had, a few weeks ago, four of the lunch attendees test positive. Although it is not readily definitive that these cases we infective at the Canberra Irish Club, it has made them and others hesitant to return. As mentioned before, we can't expect to have guest speakers or entertainers come with so few being there in the audience.

Following consultation with several of the now inactive management committee, it is clear that there is not a great prospect of many people returning in the immediate future due to the rapid increase in cases of COVID-19 everywhere. The only solution is at present to keep up the 'phone calls by those members and volunteers, to the small group that they were assigned in March 2020 after the first closure. If we can maintain regular contact with these people, they feel less isolated. There is regular contact by other groups, within the Club, outside of those groups. We also think that it is also important that those who do attend on Friday for lunch do not feel that they have been neglected if there is nobody there to greet them.

The Eddison Day Club is an integral and long-term section of the welfare area of the Woden Valley RSL Sub-Branch and it would be a shame for it to disappear.
