Military and Emergency Services Health Australia is proud to deliver MindRight, a program developed after StoryRight, in 2019 to provide Australian Defence Force (ADF) members the tools to successfully undertake the mindset shift from sailor, soldier or airman/woman to civilian.

Despite spending years developing a strong work ethic, excelling in stressful decision making and demonstrating a strong understanding of teamwork, many ADF military personnel can find the transition to civilian life difficult.

The MindRight program specifically targets common major problems veterans experience when leaving the military such as:

- Feeling socially marginalised when leaving the military
- Losing a sense of purpose
- Frustration from a clash between military and civilian codes.

MindRight is a one-day, peer-led course which will equip service men and women with the tools to understand:

members

- How military service influences your identity
- Shifting values and beliefs through life, and also from military to civilian life
- How to use self-care to fuel your resilience
- Importance of your community of care and positive impact of peer support.

In a life filled with duty and service, Queen Elizabeth II also joined up to serve her country during the Second World War.

In the final year of the war, Princess Elizabeth insisted on enlisting and serving in the Auxiliary Territorial Service (ATS), the women's branch of the British Army. Her father King George insisted she not be given a special rank and she commenced her service as a second subaltern and was later promoted to Junior Commander, the equivalent of a Captain.

She trained as a mechanic and received her qualifications just a few weeks before the end of the Second World War in Europe.

As England celebrated the end of the War in Europe on 8 May 1945 the young princess, dressed in her ATS uniform, slipped into the crowds celebrating the end of the war.

# ALERT BE WARY OF A 'RSL' GUISED PHONE SCAM IN PLAY

**ALERT: RSL PHONE SCAM** 

We have recently been alerted to a phone scam operating under the guise of RSL. Members of the public have reported receiving calls from individuals claiming to be RSL staff members and seeking 'opt-ins' to the charity.

Please note, RSL Australia does not undertake any telephone marketing and will never ask for financial contributions, donations or for any personal information via this channel.

While some of our RSL Branches do undertake fundraising campaigns periodically, this is typically through street appeals or via official RSL websites.

As per Australia's Cyber Security Centre advice, we encourage people to be extra cautious if asked to supply personal details or financial contributions via an unknown phone number or email. The recommended advice is to decline and seek clarification through the official company contact lines.

#### How to report a scam:

If you have experienced any suspicious phishing behaviour associated to the RSL please report this along with any supporting details (emails, phone numbers etc) so it can be further investigated.
