
The Governor-General and Her Excellency Mrs Linda Hurley hosted a morning tea for members of the Woden Valley RSL Sub-Branch.











Fact versus fiction: Australian prisoners of the Japanese

During the opening stages of the Imperial Japanese onslaught into south-east Asia and the Pacific during the Second World War, approximately 22,000 Australian servicemen and servicewomen were made prisoners of war. After the war public perceptions of prisoner-of-war service were shaped by wartime propaganda and postwar representations in movies such as the "Academy Award" winning *The bridge on the River Kwai*. This public presentation will address some of the facts and fiction surrounding Australian prisoners of war.

This presentation will feature stories, collection items, and artworks relating to these Australians.

The 2019 Inaugural Veterans Community day was held at the Margaret Whitlam auditorium, Canberra on 10 November 2019. It was hosted by the ACT Ministerial Advisory Council for Veterans and their families. After the welcome to country by Ngunnawal Elder, Serena Williams, Brigadier Alison Creagh CSC (Ret'd) addressed the large attendance. The commemorative address was given by Navy Veteran and AWM representative Gerard Pratt, before a wreath laying and the unveiling of the Turkish Pine Forest Sign that will be mounted near the newly established trees near the auditorium. Attendees were taken to the forest to see the young trees that have been planted in lines along steep contours; the Turkish pine was a prominent landmark tree at the ANZAC battle site at Gallipoli.'
