The Woden Valley RSL Sub-Branch is pleased to invite members and their guests to our next OGM Dinner.



After Dinner speaker:

RSL Woden Valley Sub-Branch member Terry Colhoun AM.

Terry will speak about his RSL Activities with three national presidents from 1994-2007 including "The Hand of Friendship" and, for the first time, his experiences as MC with the ANZAC Day Dawn Service, an oral history project and the Canberra-Nara Peace Park.

Terry grew up in Victoria and Tasmania. He joined the RAAF on his 18th birthday in December 1942. During his service, Terry served with Signal School Point Cook 1943-44, in 79 Wing HQ Operations Room at Batchelor and at RAAF Station Darwin in the

Northern Territory 1944-45 and finally at RAAF HQ in Melbourne. Discharged 1946, Terry joined the Citizen Air Force with the rank of Pilot Officer (Admin) during the Cold War 1953.

Terry stated a career in broadcasting at a Victorian country radio station in 1946 and then joined the ABC as Gippsland Regional Manager in 1949, Newcastle in 1956 and Branch Manager for the ACT in 1966. He was the ABC's North American representative 1979-84. Terry retired with wife Jean to Canberra after 35 years with the ABC.

Terry served two Governors-General as honorary music advisor and was appointed a Member in the Order of Australia in 1989. For services to Australia-Japan understanding, the Emporer of Japan appointed him to the Order of the Rising Sun in 1993. In 2005 Terry was nominated for ACT Senior Australian of the Year for services to the community as a writer and interviewer of distinction. Jean died in 2011 after 60 years of marriage. Terry has a daughter Diane, two married grandchildren and two great grandchildren who live in Melbourne. *Menu: Bread Roll and Butter;*

Media release on suicide commission

On Wednesday, 5 February 2020, the Morrison government announced it will establish a permanent National Commissioner for Defence and Veteran Suicide Prevention. The National Commissioner will have the enduring power, scope and resources to investigate suicides and related issues as they arise, rather than being restricted by a one-off review looking at past practices.

Prime Minister Scott Morrison said the independent Commissioner would also have the power to compel witnesses to give evidence.

The National Commissioner for Defence and Veteran Suicide Prevention will be empowered to perform two roles:

The Commissioner will be an independent and permanent public accountability body, with the same powers of a Royal Commission to compel the production of evidence and summon witnesses, and make findings and recommendations to Government.

The Commissioner will also provide an ongoing investigative function of individual cases of suicide, working with each state and territory coronial office, making recommendations to Government.

The Government will invest an initial \$40 million to support the Commissioner's work and this will be expanded to ensure they have whatever resources they need.

The Government will also establish an immediate, independent review of historical veteran suicide cases, conducted by the Commissioner, focusing on the impact of military service and veterans' post service experience.

An interim report will be delivered within 12 months. Families will be engaged in this process if they wish, with an opportunity to participate and tell their stories openly and safely.

The Australian Institute of Health and Welfare and the Australian Commission on Safety and Quality in Health Care, along with coronial and legal experts, will provide technical expertise in support of this work.

Minister for Veterans and Defence Personnel Darren Chester said the Commissioner would also deliver an Annual Veteran and Defence Suicide Death Report to the Parliament.

"This will be a transparent report directly to the Parliament on an annual basis on suicides within the defence and veteran community, including an update on the implementation and evaluation of measures to reduce suicide risk factors," Mr Chester said.

A Veteran Family Advocate will also be appointed to directly engage with the families of veterans, to improve the design of all veteran programs and services, including mental health supports and services.

"The new Veteran Family Advocate will focus on mental health and suicide prevention, and contribute to our understanding of risk factors relating to the wellbeing of veterans and their families, particularly during transition from the ADF," Mr Chester said.

"The Advocate will represent the views of veterans and their families by engaging and advocating to help shape policy and the administration of veteran benefits and support.

"We want to assure defence and veterans' families that help is available now and it can make a difference. Open Arms – Veterans and Families Counselling provides support and counselling to current ADF members, veterans and their families and can be contacted 24/7 on 1800 011 046."

•Other assistance – DVA's Veterans' Access Network (VAN) can be contacted on **1800 555 254** to assist with a wide range of issues, including replacement of aids and appliances, ensuring availability of pharmaceuticals, and arranging transportation to medical appointments.

•Veteran's Home Care – assists you to continue living independently by providing a small amount of practical help including safety related home and garden maintenance that can help prevent health and safety hazards around the home. For program clients affected by the fires please contact your service providers or assessment agency. For eligible, affected veterans that need new services or services in a new location contact a VHC Assessment Agency on 1300 550 450.
