CONSULTATION NOW OPEN ON VETERANS' LEGISLATION REFORM

The Albanese Government has today released exposure draft legislation which will simplify and harmonise the century old veterans' entitlements, compensation and rehabilitation system.

The current system is difficult to understand and complex to administer. The Royal Commission into Defence and Veteran Suicide found the system was "so complicated that it adversely affects the mental health of some veterans and can be a contributing factor to suicidality."

Following consultation, the draft legislation will simplify the veteran compensation system, with all claims to be considered under a single Act. Under the new system:

- All new claims for compensation and rehabilitation from the date of commencement would be assessed under a single Act, an improved *Military Rehabilitation and Compensation Act (MRCA)*;
- The Veterans' Entitlements Act 1986 and the Safety, Rehabilitation and Compensation (Defence-related Claims) Act 1988 would be closed to new claims following commencement of the new arrangements;
- All benefits being received under existing schemes will continue unaffected under grand-parenting arrangements. Any new claims after the commencement date (including claims for worsening of pre-existing conditions) will be assessed under the improved MRCA.

There will also be a number of improvements including:

- introduction of a new Additional Disablement Amount to provide similar benefits as the Extreme Disablement Adjustment for those post retirement age;
- making the higher travel allowance under MRCA available to all veterans and for all kilometres travelled;
- providing a pathway for veterans currently only covered by DRCA to qualify for the Specialist Medical Review Council and a Gold Card if they have a new claim accepted and
- increasing the general funeral allowance to \$3,000 with the amount previously set at \$2,000.

Today's release of draft legislation follows the Government's earlier consultation on a pathway to simplify the veterans' legislative framework, and provide better support to veterans and their families. Feedback from that consultation has guided the proposed changes announced today.

I welcome feedback and submissions from the veteran community and general public on the draft Veterans' Entitlements, Treatment and Support (Simplification and Harmonisation) Bill 2024, submissions close on <u>28 April</u> 2024.

Individual painting of helmets as souvenirs was not something traditionally done by Australian troops during the First World War. One of the most elaborate exceptions to this was the helmet belonging to Corporal Ernest Corey who served with 55 Battalion between 1916 and 1918.

THE COREY HELMET

Bill Smith and Alex Reynolds have for years researched and promoted the cause of former Australian soldier Ernest Albert Corey, who served in WWI and is the only man awarded the Military Medal four times. He painted his helmet which includes flags and battle honours and is on display in the Australian War Memorial. Ernie Corey died in 1972 aged 81 and is buried in the Military Section, Woden Cemetery.

Bill's son-in-law and artist, Mark Lonsdale volunteered to paint the Sub-Branch iconic helmet which sits atop the Lee Enfield .303 rifle and replicates the original hand-painted helmet owned by Corey from many years ago.

At a special ceremony in the Sub-Branch office, and after appropriate speeches by Bill Smith, Alex Reynolds and President Jim Gilchrist, Alex proceeded to unveil the newly painted helmet.





Speeches were being made prior to the unveiling and artist Mark Lonsdale explained the details involved in the process.

All those who attended were very impressed by the excellent work that Mark had performed in reproducing the colours, battle honours and highlights of the helmet.

Mark said it was an honour; a gesture of thanks to all those who currently serve and have served our country.

During the proceedings, the President announced that the large meeting room will be refurbished with suitable memorabilia, including trophy cases, conference facilities, banners and a military audio and pictorial library.

A plan is underway to collate previously documented material and write it into a book that not only honours Ernie Corey, but remembers his RSL membership and taps into the 103-year history of the Woden Valley Sub-Branch.




The program has been delivering hearing services for over 20 years. We are reviewing and exploring ways the program can be improved, to make it better for you and simpler for providers.

Saluting Their Service Commemorative Grants Program

The Saluting Their Service Commemorative Grants Program aims to commemorate the service and sacrifice of Australia's defence personnel in wars, conflicts and peace operations, and their families.

The Australian Government is inviting eligible organisations to apply for grant funding under the Saluting Their Service Commemorative Grants Program (the program).

The program is designed to provide funding for projects that promote appreciation and understanding of the experiences of service and the roles that those who served have played, and to preserve, add to the sum knowledge on, or provide access to information about Australia's wartime heritage.

There are 2 categories of grants available under the program:

1. Community Grants (STS-CG)

Grants to a maximum of \$10,000 are available for local, community-based projects and activities.

2. Major Grants (STS-MG)

Grants between \$10,001 and \$150,000 are available for major commemorative projects and activities that are significant from a national, state, territory and/or broader regional perspective.

Applications are now open and close 9:00 pm AEDT on Wednesday 5 February 2025.

Tickets for international 2024 Anzac Day services now available.

The Department of Veterans' Affairs is pleased to announce that tickets are now available to attend the 2024 Anzac Day Dawn Services in France and Türkiye.

Recognising the 109th anniversary of the start of the 1915 Gallipoli campaign in the First World War, services will be held on the dawn of 25 April 2024 to commemorate our brave Anzacs on the fields where they fell.

The Anzac Day Dawn Service in Gallipoli, Türkiye will take place at the Anzac Commemorative Site within the Gallipoli Peninsula. This will be followed by a mid-morning Australian Memorial service at Lone Pine Cemetery, the site of one of the fiercest battles that the Australians fought during the First World War.

The Dawn Service in France will be held at the Australian National Memorial near Villers-Bretonneux, France, followed by a service at the Digger Memorial, just outside the town of Bullecourt. The local French government will hold a series of smaller services in Villers-Bretonneux and Bullecourt throughout the day.

Kahlil Fegan DSC AM, Repatriation Commissioner said, "Anzac day is a time to come together with your loved ones in solemn reflection of those who have sacrificed so much. There's something truly moving about sharing this experience on the sacred battle fields of France and Türkiye. If you're able to travel, I encourage you to get your tickets today."


