Australian War Memorial's New Director

Mr Matt Anderson PSM is the incoming Director of the Australian War Memorial. Mr Anderson will begin his tenure in March 2020.

Mr Anderson has been Deputy High Commissioner to the United Kingdom since 2016 with the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT). He is also a former Ambassador to Afghanistan and High Commissioner to the Solomon Islands and Samoa. Prior to joining DFAT he spent eight years as an Australian Army officer, including three years as troop commander with the Royal Australian Engineers (1988 –91), and four years as a careers adviser with the Soldier Career Management Agency in Melbourne (1992–95). Mr Anderson was awarded the Public Service Medal for his role in leading the humanitarian and consular response to the 2009 Pacific tsunami.

The following article was sent to my daughter by friends in France. The link is below - but she translated the following for me.

The city of Villiers-Bretonneux in the Somme has had links with Australia for over 100 years. In addition to a twinning with an Australian town, Villers-Bretonneux has decided to launch an appeal online. While fires are still ravaging



Australia, the town of Villers-Bretonneux in the Somme is mobilizing. The city, which has 4,500 inhabitants, has launched an online appeal to help victims of fire. Mobilization and solidarity is far from new, since the links between the French commune and the mainland date back more than a century. "It is historical link" between Australia and Villers-Bretonneux explains Yves Taté, one of the administrators of the Franco-Australian museum of the town. "It dates from the First World War, 101 years ago. Australian troops repelled a German attack at Villers-Bretonneux." Twenty years later, a memorial was inaugurated to honor the thousands of Australian soldiers who came to liberate the town. Since then trips are organized regularly, hence the idea of this appeal which amounts to "around 8,500 euros after 24 hours". The mayor of Villers-Bretonneux, Patrick Simon, ensures that direct aid will be paid. "We will also help our twin sister, whose firefighters have called for donations. We have been paired with Robinvale for more than 30 years."

The Corey Helmet

Bill Smith and Alex Reynolds have for years researched and promoted the cause of the former Australian soldier Ernie Corey, who served in the First Australian Imperial Force during WW1 on the Western Front, the attack at Fromelles, the Battle of the Somme, the Battle of Passchendaele, the Battle of Arras, and WW2.

Private Corey died in 1972 aged 81 and is buried in the



Military section at Woden Cemetery. He was awarded the Military Medal four times, being the only man in the Commonwealth to ever have been so honoured. Bill's son-in-law and artist, Mark Lonsdale, recently volunteered to paint the Sub-Branch iconic helmet (pictured left) which sits atop the .303 rifle to replicate the original hand-painted one owned by Corey many years ago. It includes the flags of participating nations, gum trees, and battle honours. Mark said that it was an honour; a gesture of thanks to all those who serve and served our country.

The Sub-Branch plans to officially rename our main meeting room the Ernest Albert Corey Room in 2020.

Sub Branch President Jim Gilchrist announced that the large room will be refurbished with suitable memorabilia, including trophy cases, conference facilities, banners and a military audio and pictorial library. A plan was agreed on to collate previously documented material and write it into a book that not only honours Corey, but remembers his RSL membership, and taps into the 103-year history of the Woden Valley Sub Branch.

DVA disaster assistance- bushfire crisis

The impact of the bushfires is being felt across the nation, including by members of the veteran and defence communities. Health and safety is the priority during this time, and we encourage you to listen to the experts on how to be prepared.

The ABC, as the national broadcaster, provides <u>up-to-date information on all alerts and</u> warnings.

Further information is also available on each of the state government websites.

Members of the veteran and defence communities can also access:

The Australian Government Disaster Recovery Payment – one-off financial assistance to eligible Australians adversely affected by the bushfires. For more information on eligibility, and how to claim, visit the Department of Human Ser-vices website or call 180 22 66.

Defence Service Homes Insurance – to lodge a claim or for assistance please contact **1300 552 662** or visit the <u>Defence Service Homes Insurance website</u>.

Open Arms counselling support (24/7) – veterans and their families requiring emergency counselling support can call **1800 011 046**.

Crisis payments – a one-off payment to financially assist eligible people following a range of defined circumstances. For information about the crisis payments and eligibility please read Factsheet IS121 - Crisis Payments

Other assistance – DVA's Veterans' Ac-

cess Network (VAN) can be contacted on **1800 555 254** to assist with a wide range of issues, including replacement of aids and appliances, ensuring availability of pharmaceuticals, and arranging transportation to medical appointments.

• Veteran's Home Care – assists you to continue living independently by providing a small amount of practical help including safety related home and garden maintenance that can help prevent health and safety hazards around the home. For program clients affected by the fires please contact your service providers or assessment agency. For eligible, affected veterans that need new services or services in a new location contact a VHC Assessment Agency on 1300 550 450.
